The Women's Alliance Endowment Fund (WAEF) of the Jewish Federation Foundation of Greater Rhode Island is pleased to announce a request for proposals for 2025 Women's Alliance Endowment Fund grants. Established in 1993, the WAEF benefits Jewish women and children by supporting educational, health, cultural, and social services and programs worldwide. More than 140 women have contributed to the fund.

The WAEF encourages proposals for **new or existing programs and services that benefit Jewish women and/or children and have the potential for long-term impact**. Below are proposal guidelines:

Will be considered:

- Educational, cultural, religious, and inter-group programs (program-specific supplies/equipment, specialized staff, travel, etc.)
- Health and social services

Will not be considered:


- Proposals from organizations that have been operating for less than two years
- Proposals to purchase administration equipment/supplies or payroll
- Multi-year funding (i.e. grants paid out over several years)

All Rhode Island, Southeastern Massachusetts, and overseas Jewish organizations, agencies, and synagogues whose mission falls within the purview of the Jewish Alliance of Greater Rhode Island may submit grant requests. WAEF encourages applicants to find community partners, which need not be Jewish in affiliation. For overseas proposals, preference is given to those providing services in our partner regions of Warsaw, Poland / Afula-Gilboa, Israel / Rosario, Argentina.

This year, the Women's Alliance Endowment Fund has approximately \$10,620 to allocate. Grants will be distributed by June 30, 2024. Grants must be used by April 2025 unless programmatic considerations require an extension, and the WAEF has been notified well in advance. All grant recipients must submit a program evaluation.

Applicants must be recognized under section 501(c)(3) of the IRS code or have a U.S. Fiscal Sponsor. Please submit proposals in a **single PDF file** using the attached application to [endowment@jewishallianceri.org](mailto:endowment@jewishallianceri.org) by **April 1, 2024**.
