



WATER MITIGATION PROJECT FAQs

Why is this project happening?

This project is designed to reduce the risk of flooding and strengthen the long-term resilience and sustainability of our building.

When does construction begin, and how long will it last?

Construction is expected to begin during the week of September 22 and will take approximately three months to complete. Project timelines may be adjusted due to weather or other circumstances.

Where will members and visitors park?

During construction, members and visitors may use the Brown University Stadium parking lot located across the street. We will provide advance notice if there are any dates when this lot will not be available. Street parking will also remain available.

Will all building entrances remain open?

No. The back entrance will be closed throughout the construction period.

Will accessible parking still be available?

Yes. We are exploring opportunities to expand accessible parking options closer to the front entrance to make building access as convenient as possible.

What will happen to the Holocaust Memorial sculpture during construction?

We are developing a plan to protect and temporarily relocate the sculpture during construction. Additional details will be shared once those plans are finalized.

Will the community be able to access the mikveh during construction?

Yes. Access to the mikveh will continue during construction. We are currently finalizing logistics and will provide additional information before work begins.

What will happen to the compost bins during construction?

We are working with neighboring organizations to determine the best temporary solution for the compost bins during construction. More information will be shared as plans are finalized.

How will I receive project updates?
